

CFP: Teaching Rape Texts, an At-Large APA/CAAS Panel, 2010

Following up on the enormous interest generated by the roundtable discussion at this year's APA, Lillian Doherty (ldoherty@umd.edu) is organizing an at-large panel for next year's APA meeting and, if enough people are interested, a panel for the CAAS meeting in fall 2008 (October 8-10) as well. If anyone is interested in co-organizing, please inform Lillian. Because this is not an officially-sponsored WCC panel, it will not compete with the panel already planned for next year.

I am inviting abstracts for programming a small number of very short papers (about 10 minutes each), intended primarily to open up the topic for extensive discussion and sharing of strategies for use both inside and outside the classroom. The abstract should be one or two paragraphs in length; it should describe the type of institution at which you teach and the specific aspect of the issue you would expect to address in your paper.

The deadline for submitting panel proposals to the APA is March 16, so if you are interested in participating, please send me an abstract as soon as possible and **no later than February 23, 2009**. Please send it as an e-mail message or attachment to Prof. Lillian Doherty, Classics, University of Maryland (ldoherty@umd.edu).

In your cover message on the abstract, be sure to indicate: whether you would be available to participate in both panels, or just the one at APA, or just the one at CAAS (the panels don't need to be the same); if you think you may be involved in another presentation at APA, since you cannot be on the program twice. (There is a time lag after the panels are vetted so that people on panels that are turned down can submit individual abstracts.)
